In 20 docto	07 I started my legal career with Sigmon Law Firm in Memphis, Tennessee. I defended rs, nurses and hospitals from what were then referred to as medical malpractice claims.

These types of cases are now referred to as healthcare liability actions. In January of 2011 Sigmon Law Firm merged with Hardison Law Firm. However, the nature of my practice did not change. In 2011 I moved to Middle Tennessee and began working in insurance defense as a trial attorney with The Law Office of Glenda Pipkin. This was as a staff attorney for Hanover Insurance Group. In approximately 2014 the office name changed to The Law Office of Glenda Hawkins.

6. Describe the nature of your present law practice, listing the major areas of law in which you practice and the percentage each constitutes of your total practice.

I currently practice as a trial attorney representing Hanover Insurance Company's insureds in litigation throughout the entire State of Tennessee and a large portion of Georgia. I am licensed in Federal Court for the Western and Middle Districts of Tennessee and the Northern District of Georgia. Ninety-nine percent of my work is defense work. I estimate that 50% of my work involves motor vehicle accidents, 30% are premises liability actions, 10% of my work is products liability or professional liability claims. Approximately 9% of my practice involves coverage opinions and policy interpretation and the remaining 1% are Plaintiff's subrogation claims.

7. Describe generally your experience (over your entire time as a licensed attorney) in trial courts, appellate courts, administrative bodies, legislative or regulatory bodies, other forums, and/or transactional matters.

My practice is somewhat unique in that I travel extensively and practice all over the state of Tennessee as a trial attorney. The vast majority of my cases throughout my career have been in Circuit Court. I have first chaired jury trials across Tennessee from Shelby County to Knox County and many counties in between, including Rutherford County. Approximately 30% of my practice includes litigating and defending claims in Georgia. I am a trial attorney and have spent my entire career litigating cases at the trial level.

8. Describe any matters of special note involving your practice in trial courts, appellate courts, and administrative bodies.

I have first chaired numerous jury trials across the entire State of Tennessee and in virtually every major county in the State. Additionally I have appeared in even more courts on motion hearings. I always endeavor to treat litigants and opposing counsel with the utmost respect and professionalism. I actively litigate cases in Federal Court in Tennessee and Georgia.

In 2006 I worked as a law clerk to the late Honorable Rita Stotts in Division IV of Shelby County Circuit Court. As a law clerk I was responsible to ensure that the weekly trial docket ran smoothly and researched any novel issues raised in the weekly motions and discussed those with Judge Stotts. I was also tasked with researching other novel issues of law in pending cases and drafting opinions on behalf of Judge Stotts. I worked closely with attorneys in ensuring that Judge Stotts was prepared for court each day. I saw first-hand how Circuit Court operates and it provided a firm foundation for my legal career as a trial attorney.

ESSAYS/PERSONAL STATEMENTS

28. What are your reasons for seeking this position? (150 words or less)

My experience representing clients throughout the State of Tennessee has offered me the unique opportunity to observe best practices in courtrooms across the State and this familiarity has prepared me to implement this knowledge in helping the 16th Judicial District function efficiently and fairly for litigants and attorneys. I have observed how judges in varying jurisdictions have utilized varying methods in an attempt to manage their courtroom and dockets and I have observed those that that are more effective and others that are less effective. I will use this knowledge to assist attorneys and litigants in resolving and moving their cases toward resolution.

Additionally, I recognize that courts need judges who are knowledgeable and experienced trial attorneys who also have the work ethic to facilitate moving cases to resolution. As a judge I will apply the law impartially and respect each attorney's time and efforts by being punctual and well prepared for court hearings and trials.

29. Describe the judgeship you seek (i.e. geographic area, types of cases, number of judges, etc. and explain how your selection would impact the court. (150 words or less)

I seek appointment to the Circuit Court for the 16th Judicial District, which includes Rutherford and Cannon Counties. This District currently has four Circuit Court judges. Two judges currently cover the civil docket and two judges currently cover the criminal docket.

During law school I enjoyed virtually all of my classes and I enjoy the study and application of the law. My practice has always centered on civil litigation; however, I would enjoy working on both civil and criminal dockets. I see my role as being at the service of the judicial district and will assist in any way I can.

I anticipate that my selection will enable the 16th Judicial District to continue providing stellar service to litigants and attorneys practicing before the court despite the increased number of cases. I hope to stand on the shoulders of those distinguished judges who have gone before and those who currently serve in the office and lift it higher.

Yes, I will uphold the law. I have never looked at a law with the determination to decide whether I agree or disagree with it. I have never seen that as my role as an attorney, and, frankly I cannot think of a bigger waste of my client's time than to decide whether I agree with a law. The law is the law and a judge's role is to apply the law fairly based upon the

facts of the case.

I enjoy litigating cases with competent zealous attorneys on the other side of the case. I have a great respect for the practice of law; however, I quickly lose respect for an attorney that does not put forth their best efforts for their client. Likewise, judges lose the respect of attorneys when they attempt to influence litigation by failing to uphold the law as it is written.

My wife and I recently had the opportunity to provide a home for two young girls who were removed from their home due to allegations of severe abuse by their parents. We were disappointed when after several months the court returned them to one of the parents despite what we felt were well-founded concerns for their safety. However we respected the process and recognized that judges and attorneys can only operate within the confines of what the law prescribes. As a judge I will impartially apply the law.
