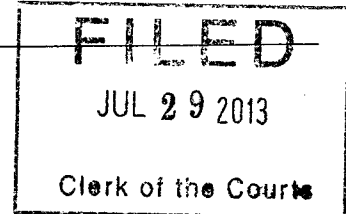

**ORDER**


It appearing to the Board that the Honorable Kay Spalding Robilio has submitted her retirement as an active Judge to be effective September 1, 2013, and it further appearing that the withdrawal and dismissal of this matter is appropriate and has been approved by the hearing panel of the Board of Judicial Conduct, the Honorable Christ Craft, Chairperson of the Tennessee Board of Judicial Conduct, hereby ORDERS as follows:

That these formal charges, which have been filed concerning the Honorable Kay Spalding Robilio, are hereby withdrawn and dismissed and any and all additional complaints against Judge Robilio which are or may be submitted to the Tennessee Board of Judicial Conduct by any other individuals will not be considered or pursued so long as the Honorable Kay Spalding Robilio does not become a judicial candidate nor accept any appointment to serve as a judge. However, nothing herein shall preclude her from engaging as a Rule 31 Mediator or acting in any other non-judicial roles, including, but not limited to, ADR matters.


Judge Robilio assents to the provisions of this Order since she has no intention to run for judicial office or accept any judicial appointment at any time after September 1, 2013.


