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**ORDER**

Upon consideration of the application for permission to appeal of the State of Tennessee and the record before us, the Court concludes that the Court of Criminal Appeals improvidently granted the Tennessee Rule of Appellate Procedure 10 Extraordinary Appeal because the trial court did not so far depart from the accepted and usual course of judicial proceedings as to require immediate review and because a review was not necessary for a complete determination of the action on appeal. *See Gilbert v. Wessels*, 458 S.W.3d 895, 898-99 (Tenn. 2014).

Accordingly, the application for permission to appeal is summarily granted, the order of the Court of Criminal Appeals granting an extraordinary appeal and the judgment of the Court of Criminal Appeals are hereby vacated, and the case is remanded to the Criminal Court for Putnam County for further proceedings. The costs of this appeal are taxed to the State of Tennessee.
