Rule 8 and the RPC's that always need to be considered:

- Competence (Rule 1.1) What are the effects of the delinquency adjudication at juvenile court? What about collateral issues for the parent and for the child? Read the new Juvenile Rules of Practice and Procedure.
- b. Scope of Representation and Allocation of Authority Between Client and Lawyer (Rule 1.2)
- c. Confidentiality (Rule 1.6) all clients have a right to confidentiality
- d. Communication (Rule 1.4) Know who your client is and talk with them at a level that they can understand and process the information.
- e. Client with Diminished Capacity (Rule 1.14)
- Diligence (Rule 1.3) Cover all of the bases for your client. Look into their competency, develop solid defenses and mitigation strategies. Get their school records. Be ready to fully advocate fort your client.
