Please find enclosed the statistical report of the Board of Judicial Conduct covering filings and dispositions for the month of August, 2014, as mandated by Tenn. Code Ann. § 17-5-207(a).

Please also find enclosed the Quarterly Report for the fourth quarter of this fiscal year, as mandated by Tenn. Code Ann. § 17-5-207(b). Tenn. Code Ann. § 17-5-207(d) states that "The September report shall also contain a five (5) year statistical comparison of the prior five (5) fiscal years for the same categories." However, as the Board has only completed two fiscal years, no statistical comparison with more than two years can be included with this report. One will be included next year with the September 20, 2015 report, comparing the first three years.

The Board will also begin to include in our Quarterly Reports for Fiscal Year 2014-2015 the following information pursuant to new Tenn. Pub. Acts Ch. 858:

A list of votes taken by each board member as follows:

- (A) The member's name;
- (B) The total number of times the member voted to dismiss a complaint while on an investigative panel; and
- (C) The total number of times the member voted to authorize an investigation while on an investigative panel.

The Board at its semi-annual meeting in August discussed the issue of what was meant by the term "authorize an investigation," particularly as members of an investigative panel often ask that additional information be gathered by disciplinary counsel prior to voting on whether or not a formal investigation should be opened pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 17-5-304(c). It was unanimously felt by the Board, after extended discussion, that the legislature did not wish that mere requests for additional information by a panel member be counted as votes "for an investigation," but only the single vote by each member on whether to dismiss or open a "formal investigation," the term used by Tenn. Code Ann. § 17-5-304(c), which mandates the procedure by which each investigative panel is to handle a complaint. If it were otherwise, multiple votes would be recorded by each member for each complaint, making the vote total fairly meaningless. A member might ask for some additional fact, easily gathered, just to be recorded as voting for "an investigation," prior to voting later to dismiss the complaint.

Therefore, our First Quarterly Report for fiscal year 2014-2015 will include a list of members' names along with the total of votes cast on each complaint either 1) voting to dismiss the complaint, 2) voting for a formal investigation on the complaint or 3) not voting. (Tenn. Code Ann. § 17-5-304(c)(3) -"The investigative panel shall review the disciplinary counsel's recommendations and either dismiss the complaint or authorize a full investigation.")
