ORDER

On May 22, 2007, this Court set the execution of Edward Jerome Harbison for September 26, 2007. On August 14, 2007, Edward Jerome Harbison filed pro se in this Court a “Notice of Filing” requesting that the Court review the merits of Harbison’s claim of fraud upon the court and his “60(b)(6) Motion.” Harbison also filed a pro se “Motion to Hold Case in Abeyance” alleging that certain claims have not been fully developed in the trial or appellate courts. However, neither the Notice nor the Motion refers to any pending actions in the Tennessee courts. To the extent that the referenced claims are currently being litigated, or will be litigated, in the federal courts, a request for stay of execution is more appropriately addressed to the federal courts. Coe v. State, 17 S.W.3d 251 (Tenn. 2000).

Upon due consideration, the requests for relief in the Notice of Filing and the Motion to Hold Case in Abeyance are DENIED.
