Petitioner-Appellant Sedley Alley respectfully moves this Court to order the preservation of biological samples on which he seeks to perform DNA analysis. Specifically, pending the outcome of Sedley Alley's appeal in this matter and his pending emergency motion for production of biological samples, this Court should order all state agents, including the Shelby County Office of the Medical Examiner and University of Tennessee Toxicology and Chemical Pathology Laboratory in Memphis, Tennessee to preserve and protect all biological samples related to the case of Suzanne Collins, Lab No. 85-1775, 85-1778, Medical Examiner Case No. 85-1681. In particular, this Court should order the preservation of the following specimens:

- Vaginal swabs from the victim;¹
- (2) Swab taken from the victim's right inner thigh;²

- (3) Swab taken from the victim's left inner thigh,³
- (4) Nasopharyngeal swabs from the victim;⁴
- (5) Oral swabs from the victim;⁵
- (6) Rectal swabs from the victim;⁶
- (7) Head hairs from an African-American individual found on the victim's socks,

which do not match Sedley Alley, who is caucasian (Q7);7

- (8) A caucasian body hair found on the victim's waistband (Q6);⁸
- (9) A caucasian pubic hair found on the victim's left shoe (Q1);⁹
- (10) A hair found on a stick found in the victim;¹⁰ and

(11) Blood and hair samples of the victim.11

All of these samples contain biological evidence which will establish the identity of the person or persons who committed the sexual assault and murder of the victim in this case. Therefore, they should be ordered preserved to allow DNA analysis by the Petitioner-Appellant in this case. See Tenn. Code Ann. §40-30-309 (courts may order preservation of biological specimens for DNA testing).
