

Member of House or Senate

•Governor

- Response to Public request
- Response to Court Decision
- Response to Changing Times
- Personal Situation

Governor

- All of the above reasons
- Reform in a Governmental System (Judicial reform)

Process before floor presentation

- Filing of the Bill with the Clerk's office & numbering
 - Introduction on 1st reading (done during floor session)
 - Pass on 2nd Consideration and Assigned to Committee

- Sub-Committee presentation & testimony
- Committee presentation & testimony
- Sent to Calendar & Rules Committee
- Bill presented and moved for passage on 3rd and final consideration

After Passage

- Sent to be engrossed (final draft with amendments)
 - Companion bill (must be exactly the same in both chambers)
 - Bill is Enrolled (prepared for signatures of Speakers)
- Signed By Speakers

- Signed by Governor
- Sent to the Secretary of the State and assigned a Public Chapter Number
- Incorporated into the Code
