- c. Communication (Rule 1.4) - Know who your client is and talk with them at a level that they can understand and process the information.
Diligence (Rule 1.3) – Cover all of the bases for your client. Look into their competency; develop solid defenses and mitigation strategies. Get their school records. Be ready to fully advocate for your client.
