Re: 30th Judicial District Chancery Court Vacancy

Dear Governor Lee:

On December 8, 2020, your office notified the Trial Court Vacancy Commission of a vacancy in Chancery Court, Part I of the 30th Judicial District created by Chancellor Walter L. Evans' retirement. The Commission publicized this vacancy and set December 22, 2020 as the deadline for submitting applications. The Commission also made arrangements to hold a public hearing regarding this vacancy on February 2, 2021 in Memphis.

The application deadline has now passed, and the Commission has received only two applications. The purpose of this letter is to notify you that the Commission cannot provide you with the names of three persons qualified to fill this vacancy pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 17-4-308(h) because only two persons have applied. Accordingly, Tenn. Code Ann. § 17-4-310(a) permits you to fill the vacancy with any person of your choosing who is duly licensed to practice law and otherwise fully qualified to serve as a judge of the criminal court in the 6th Judicial District.

For your information, I have included with this letter the redacted applications of the two persons who filed timely applications for this position.
