After 40 years of legal practice, I am now semi-retired following my campaign for General Sessions judge in 2022. I am actively engaged in pro bono and charity work.

I voluntarily went on temporary inactive status in California to benefit from a reduced bar fee. I returned to active status in California in 2021.

After graduating law school in December 1982, I started my legal career at General Motors in January 1983. I have been active in the practice of law ever since. During this span, I was a litigator (GM & Nissan), corporate in-house lawyer (GM, Nissan, Diocese), adjunct professor (Vanderbilt Law & University of Michigan), and finance, sales, and operations executive (Infiniti Division, NNA and Diocese of Nashville).

Prior to law school, I worked in various non-legal roles, including owning and operating a gas station, teaching math in high school, and coaching track and field and cross country. I was a member of the faculty at the University of Detroit (teaching accounting and finance), and I held a leadership position at a not-for-profit management consulting company, Accounting Aid Society. We also provided income tax preparation services for low income individuals and I testified on the VITA program to a congressional subcommittee. I earned my CPA and CMA certificates.

6. Describe the nature of your present law practice, listing the major areas of law in which you practice and the percentage each constitutes of your total practice.

Following my campaign for Sumner County General Sessions judge, I have been semi-retired for the past 18 months. Formerly, my practice involved litigation/trials (60% to 20%), contracts/transactional (20% to 50%), and client counseling (15% to 30%)—each varying on an annual basis. Presently, I provide transactional advice and contract drafting assistance on a pro bono basis.

7. Describe generally your experience (over your entire time as a licensed attorney) in trial courts, appellate courts, administrative bodies, legislative or regulatory bodies, other forums, and/or transactional matters.

My legal career started at General Motors Corporation Legal Department with a staff of around 500 people. We handled the legal affairs for GM worldwide. I started in the Appellate Group assisting with briefs. Then I rotated to writing contracts and warranties. Next, I asked to join the newly formed Trials Group where I was part of a three attorney team. We tried cases across the country in federal court and responded to government investigations. In essence, I was the associate of two more seasoned attorneys. Cases involved contract disputes, fraud, dealer relations, environmental inquiries, and other matters. While in the group, I tried a contract dispute with a supplier. The company appealed to the 6th Circuit Court of Appeals where I received a favorable ruling from the bench. <u>Steve Y.C. Ho, et al v. General Motors Corporation, et al.</u> 661 F. Supp 618 (E.D. Mich 1987 but later de-published).

Next, I moved to the Litigation Group and handled Breach of Warranty cases in Michigan and Texas. I was counsel of record in lower Michigan and supervised outside counsel for the cases in Texas. I appeared in court for motions, discovery disputes, and trials. I became an expert in Automotive Dealer Manufacturer statutes (similar to franchise law). My cases were across the USA, most often in Texas, Florida, and California. One of my first bench trials was in Macomb County, Michigan (Ed Rinke Chevrolet Company vs General Motors, et al...) The Dealer cases were often before ALJs attached to Motor Vehicle Boards. Cases would last from a week to a month with expert witnesses. I likely have over 200 trial days. I was fortunate to prevail in each case where I was trial counsel or co-counsel, sometimes setting state law precedent.

In 1991, I was recruited by Nissan North America. Initially I managed the marketing group

which included dealer relations, advertising, warranty, trademark, and related litigation. We provided the client its legal advice and litigation defense, either directly or through outside counsel. Later, I managed all non-personal injury litigation to include employment, antitrust, class actions, and multi-district litigation. I directed or reviewed all decisions on strategy and briefing. In some instances, I was co-counsel. I supervised 5 to 8 other attorneys and their caseloads. When head of legal for Nissan Canada, I was involved in a Canadian trademark court case over the letter "M".

At the Diocese of Nashville, I provided advice on contracts, employment, and other topics. Litigation was done through outside counsel with whom I worked closely.

I have appeared in trial courts in MI, CA, WI, TX, and TN and before Administrative bodies (ALJs) in CA, FL and TX, among others. I have lobbied for and drafted changes to legislation in OR, TX, and CA. I have prepared legal responses to various regulatory inquiries and provided input to the Department of Justice when examining the merger of companies offering services to the automotive industry. I have personally drafted or reviewed hundreds of contracts for purchase of goods, real property, use of trademarks, copyright, advertising, warranties, and services.

- 8. Describe any matters of special note involving your practice in trial courts, appellate courts, and administrative bodies.
 - (A) I was in house counsel for Diocese of Nashville in <u>Mich. Catholic Conf. et al. v. Burwell</u> <u>et al.</u> challenging the HHS secretary requiring employers to cover abortions in their medical insurance coverage. I assisted in case strategy and briefing. I also worked with trial counsel on the subsequent settlement with DOJ favoring the plaintiffs.
 - (B) Several notable trial results, including
 - a. Representing my client in multi-district and class action litigation.
 - b. Receiving a decision from the bench in the 6th Circuit.
 - c. Achieving favorable decisions of first impression in several venues.
 - d. Coordinating with Creditors counsel on behalf of 30 entities (IOI bankruptcy) who filed claims in the bankruptcy cases.

On a pro bono basis, I have represented incarcerated individuals, assisted individuals with appealing denial of medical insurance coverage, represented persons charged with DUI, possession and sale of drugs, and advised people on contracts.

I have not applied for a state or federal judicial position previously. I previously ran for General Sessions judge in Sumner County in 2022.

I have developed patience, sensibility, and a commitment to justice. My approach to cases will thoughtfully focus on ascertaining the facts, examining the law, and adhering to precedent. I have honed my analytic discipline and am confident in my ability to reach an unbiased, just, and legally prudent decision. My professional and civic career reflects my tireless work ethic, my faith in mankind, and my commitment to service to others. I have the time, energy, dedication, and passion to continue my career as the second circuit court judge of Sumner County.

29. Describe the judgeship you seek (i.e. geographic area, types of cases, number of judges, etc. and explain how your selection would impact the court. (150 words or less)

The executive branch approved an additional Circuit Court Judge for the 18th judicial district, Sumner County. The 18th District presently has one judge each for Circuit, Criminal, and Chancellor. There are three county General Sessions judges. This position is nominally the second Circuit Court judge but is expected to assist with caseloads for all the state court judges, both civil and criminal dockets. I can immediately ease the civil case load and begin to handle criminal cases, where I have some (admittedly, not a lot of) experience. I believe I can work collaboratively with all of the judges and promote the court's presence in the community.

The role of the judge is to apply the law to the facts in an unbiased manner. My personal views or opinion of the substance of the law can have no bearing on the matter at hand. The integrity of the court is paramount, and the decision rendered by the court must be strictly determined by the applicable law and facts presented. I have practiced with this philosophy throughout my forty year career and do not have an example where it did not apply.
