AOC's process

Policy changes that simplify claims (examples)

- Miscellaneous expenses in Sec. 4(a)(3)(I) have been broadened – requiring fewer motions/orders for prior approval. HOWEVER, this does not include court reporter expenses, nor fees that are waived by statute or required to be paid by another agency.
- Un-receipted postage increased \$8/day per claim

Areas Where You Can Help

Complex and Extended Orders: Educate attorneys

Complex and Extended Orders: R. 13, Sec. 2(e)

- Caps are doubled 2(e)(3)
- Motion & order certifying C&E is required 2(e)(1)
- Approval by AOC is also required (review by Chief Justice provided) 2(e)(2)

APPOINTMENT ORDERS:

A Plea from Indigent Services Team Auditors

Appointment orders often are not printed, type-written documents and appointments are made from the bench. Because the AOC is audited by the Comptroller to insure we follow and enforce our own rule, *legible handwriting* on the name of appointed counsel and the date.

Areas Where You Can Help

APPOINTMENT ORDERS:

Finding of Indigency and Orders of Substitution

Orders of appointment must have a finding of indigency, unless it states that the Public Defender is conflicted out of a case. If the attorney fails to include finding of continuing indigency in a proposed order of substitution, either handwrite that language in or instruct the attorney to re-draft the order.
