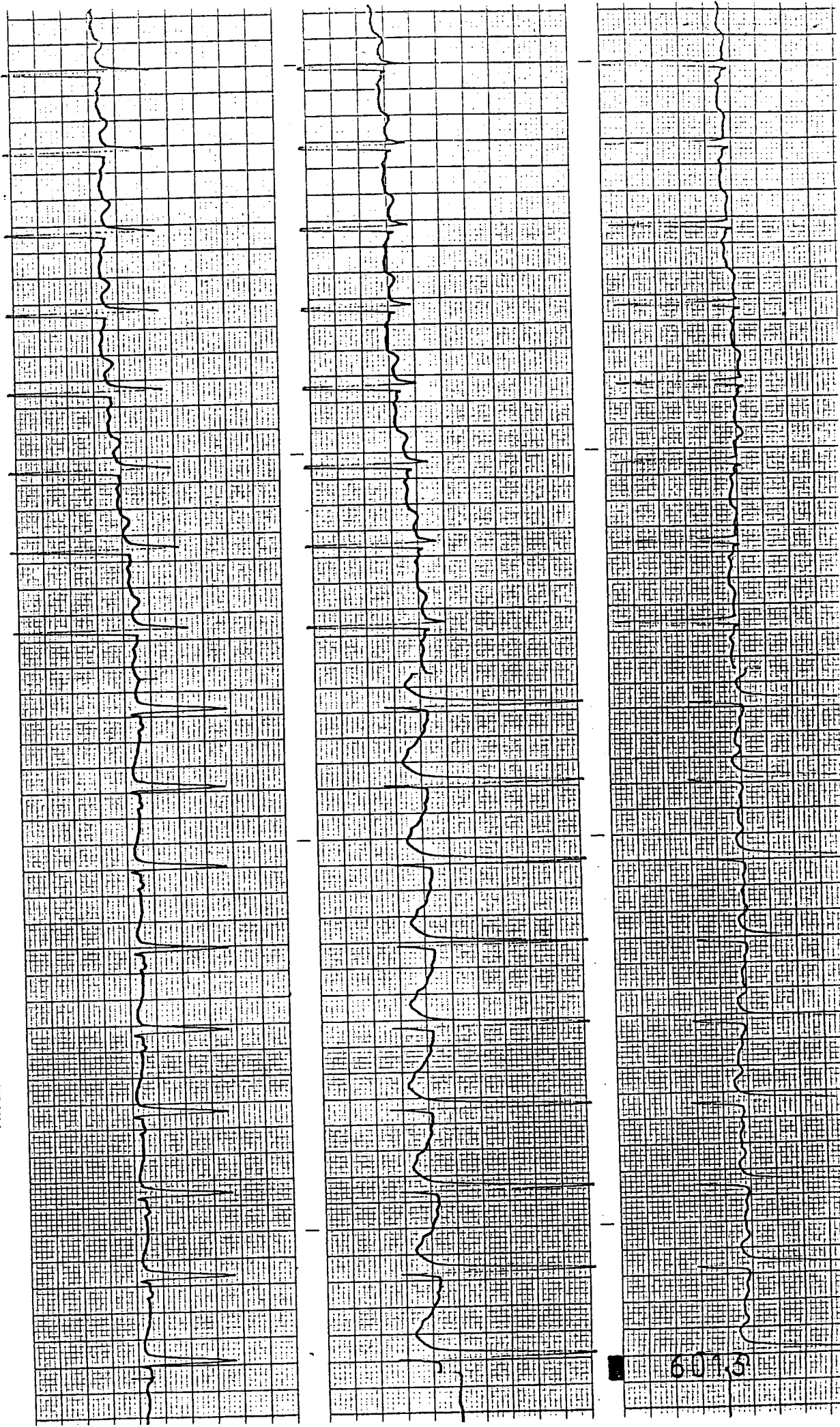

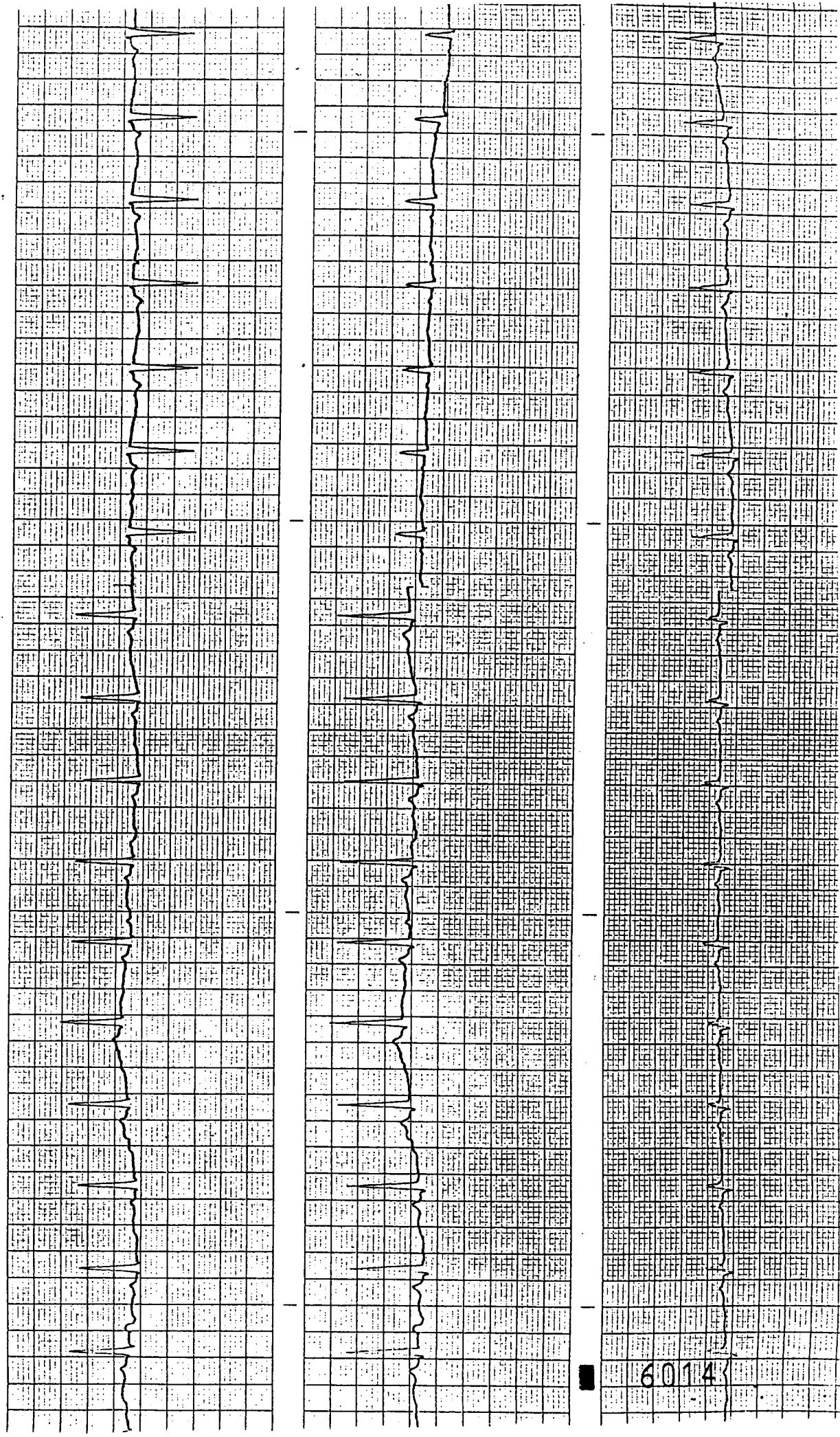

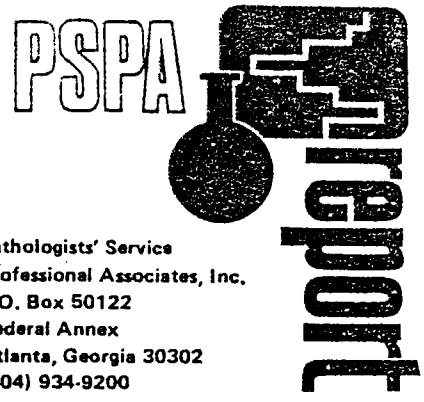

ailed Murder Suspect Takes Apparent Overdose

SPRINGFIELD, Tenn. — Edmond Zagorski, a convicted mercenary, was found dead in a jail cell after an apparent overdose of pills, a sheriff's spokesman said yesterday.

Zagorski, 28, was held in his maximum security cell at the Robertson County Jail yesterday after undergoing emergency treatment Monday at Jesse Holman Jones Hospital.

He is on medication, said Robertson County Sheriff Ted Emery yesterday, and several other inmates in the cell block are also on medication. "We feel that he saved up his pills and that some of the others' pills were in it and some of them."

His arrest followed the discovery of the bodies of two men near a boat operator Jimmy Dotson, 28, and a late Dotson, 35, in a wooded area. A cutter, which was used to cut a small creek off a 65-acre Robertson County tract, was found nearby.
