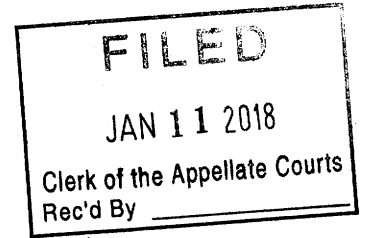

### NOTICE

---

By order dated December 17, 2013, this Court granted a motion filed by the State of Tennessee to set an execution date for the defendant Donnie Johnson. The Court set a date of March 24, 2015.

On December 22, 2014, the Court vacated its order setting an execution date due to ongoing litigation and appeal of a declaratory judgment action challenging the constitutionality of Tennessee's lethal injection protocol. The Court ultimately ruled that the petitioners in that matter, which included the defendant Johnson, failed to show that the State's method of execution violated the Eighth Amendment or was otherwise unlawful. *West v. Schofield*, 519 S.W.3d 550 (Tenn. 2017).


Petitioners filed two separate petitions for a writ of certiorari in the United States Supreme Court seeking further review of this Court's decision. *Stephen Michael West, et al. v.*


*Tony Parker, et al.*, No. 17-6024 (U.S.); *Abu Ali Abdur'Rahman, et al. v. Tony Parker, et al.*, No. 17-6068 (U.S.).

The State now provides notice that the Supreme Court denied certiorari in both petitions on November 27, 2017, and January 8, 2018, respectively. Copies of the two letters from the U.S. Supreme Court notifying the parties that certiorari has been denied in the respective petitions are attached. Thus, the defendant's challenge to the lethal injection protocol is finally concluded, and this Court's February 26, 2015, reprieve is lifted or dissolved. *See* Tenn. Sup. Ct. R. 12.4(E) ("Where the date set by the Court for execution has passed by reason of a stay or reprieve, this Court shall sua sponte set a new date of execution when the stay or reprieve is lifted or dissolved, and the State shall not be required to file a new motion to set an execution date.").




