For almost 30 years, I have practiced in the field of criminal law, either as a prosecutor or defender, at both the trial and appellate level.

I believe justice depends not only upon the law, but on who is interpreting and applying the law. A judge should have experience in the field of adjudication; I have almost 3 decades of experience in criminal matters, both as a prosecutor and a defense counsel. The right to receive a fair trial is important, of course, to a criminal accused, but is equally important to the State as well. My experience as a lawyer, and especially my experience on both "sides" of the criminal justice system, makes me well-qualified to serve.

Criminal Court Judge for the 13th Judicial District.

A judge must be able to separate his or her personal feelings, beliefs, and biases in ensuring the law is upheld. It is the judge's role to interpret and enforce the laws promulgated by the legislature, regardless of his or her personal feelings. An example of an instance when I've enforced a law even if I've disagreed with the substance of the law is when I've represented the Air Force in discharge proceedings against airmen based upon their sexual orientation. During my period of service, homosexuality was a bar to continued military service, and service members identifying as homosexual were discharged, regardless of their contribution to the mission. My personal belief that a person's contribution to the mission should be based on individual merit and not sexual orientation did not prevent me from representing the Air Force in discharge boards on that matter.
