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INTRODUCTION

Tennessee Code Annotated section 17-4-301 et seq. charges the Trial Court Vacancy Commission with assisting the Governor and the People of Tennessee in finding and appointing the best qualified candidates for judicial offices in this State. Please consider the Commission's responsibility in answering the questions in this application questionnaire. PROFESSIONAL BACKGROUND AND WORK EXPERIENCE

1. State your present employment.

I am a self-employed attorney practicing in the Middle Tennessee area.

2. State the year you were licensed to practice law in Tennessee and give your Tennessee Board of Professional Responsibility number.

On October 22, 1998, I received my license to practice law in Tennessee. My Board of Professional Responsibility number is 019278.

I have had a license to practice law in Tennessee since October 22, 1998, my bar number is 019278. I also have had a license to practice law in the state of Illinois since November 5, 1998. My bar number in Illinois is 6255554. My law license in the state of Illinois is on Inactive Status.

I placed my Illinois license on inactive status in 2004 due to the fact that I no longer lived in the state of Illinois and I did not have any active cases in Illinois.

6. Describe the nature of your present law practice, listing the major areas of law in which you practice and the percentage each constitutes of your total practice.

I am a sole practitioner. My present law practice has been focused exclusively to family law cases in the Circuit, Chancery, General Sessions and Juvenile Courts in the counties that make up the Middle Tennessee area. I believe my first family law case that I handled in Middle Tennessee was in 1999, shortly after starting my first job here in Nashville. I have experience in the area of divorce and family law litigation for over twenty-five (25) years.

The cases I have handled have been focused in the area of divorce and post-divorce modifications involving the issues of custody, child support, visitation, alimony, grandparent visitation, parental relocation, division of the marital estate, and alimony. I have also handled cases involving paternity, and contempt. I have been involved in cases with the Department of Children's Services alleging Dependency and Neglect. I have also handled Petitions to terminate parental rights, a few adoption cases, cases involving grandparents seeking visitation, parental relocation cases, orders of protection cases, and prenuptial agreements. I have handled cases in Davidson County and all of the contiguous counties during the entirety of my legal career. I have personally handled well over a thousand (1,000) family law files.

In 2019, I began working with an immigration law firm out of Memphis, Tennessee to appear in the Juvenile Court for the hearing on the Petition for Special Immigrant Juvenile Status (SIJS) with the United States and Immigration Services to appoint a permanent guardian of a minor under the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA). I have appeared on approximately fifty (50) cases. This is a small percentage of my practice, but one that I really enjoy.

I have represented over a handful of cases in my career at the Appellate Court level. I have been both the appellant and appellee in those cases. The first appellate court case I handled was in 2001 and the last was a couple of years ago. This part of my practice is a very small percentage of my total practice, although I enjoy researching and writing appellate court briefs.

7. Describe generally your experience (over your entire time as a licensed attorney) in trial courts, appellate courts, administrative bodies, legislative or regulatory bodies, other forums, and/or transactional matters.

When I first started practicing in Nashville, I worked for a sole practitioner who had a general practice handling a variety of different types of legal matters. I was able to work on a jury trial, handle a forfeiture hearing, represent litigants in criminal cases, work on personal injury files, medical malpractice cases and workers compensation cases.

I have had over twenty-five years' experience in the Circuit, Chancery, General Sessions and Juvenile Courts in Davidson County and the contiguous counties representing litigants in family law cases. Not every single case necessitated the court to have an actual trial to decide the matter because most cases settled either before or after mediation. However, the motion practice in most of the cases was significant. I have attended hundreds of mediations with my clients over my legal career.

I have appeared in Juvenile Court on approximately fifty (50) cases for the hearing on the Petition for Special Immigrant Juvenile Status (SIJS) with the United States and Immigration Services to appoint a permanent guardian of a minor under the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA).

I have handled six (6) appellate court cases in my career.

I have represented approximately thirty (30) cases at the Administrative Agency for the Social Security Administration.

8. Describe any matters of special note involving your practice in trial courts, appellate courts, and administrative bodies.

In approximately 2004, I began handling Social Security disability cases at the appeals level in the administrative courts for an administrative hearing. I believe I handled around thirty (30) cases. The last year that I had a Social Security Disability case, it ended in approximately 2017.

In June 2014, I attended the Institute for Conflict Management at Lipscomb University completing the Rule 31 Family Mediation Training. In January 2015, I became a Rule 31 Listed Mediator in the field of Family Mediation by the Tennessee Supreme Court Alternative Dispute Resolution Commission. I have conducted over sixty (60) mediations.

After Supreme Court Rule 53 was added in 2019, I have been involved in a handful of Collaborative cases that were able to successfully settle.

I submitted a prior application in 2022 for a 20th Judicial District Court Circuit Appointment.

The Board of Professional Responsibility has investigated, closed and dismissed seven complaints made against me from 2001 through 2016. The Alternative Dispute Resolution Commission investigated, closed and dismissed one complaint against me in 2024.

In 2015 I filed suit against a previous client that owed an outstanding balance after I finished her case. It was filed in the Davidson County General Sessions court to collect the debt. The defendant in that case filed a *pro se* counter-claim against me after she was served with the civil warrant alleging that I committed malpractice. The case was dismissed. The docket number is 15GC7030CC.

I have dedicated nearly all of my entire professional career to the area of family law having twenty-five years of experience litigating cases and practicing in the trial and appellate courts throughout Middle Tennessee. I am compelled to apply for this vacancy. The length of time that I have focused on and litigated cases in this area of the law makes me the best qualified candidate for this position which I will use to improve upon access to the court system. I have represented people who were the plaintiffs and others who were the defendants. My experiences have given me the ability to hear and understand both sides of an issue. I want to create and maintain a courtroom environment of integrity, diligence to work ethic and compassion for the litigants to ensure public confidence in our court system.

I am seeking the appointment for the 20th Judicial District Judicial Vacancy which is the Third Circuit Court for Davidson County, Tennessee. This Circuit shares the responsibility for hearing all of the domestic relations cases in Davidson County with the Fourth Circuit Court. There are hundreds of new divorce and post-divorce filings every year. This court would be responsible for adjudicating numerous petitions including those filed by self-represented litigants. This court is very busy and my experience in this area of the law, along with the length of time that I have been practicing in this area, would be beneficial for a smooth transition into this position.

I will always uphold the law. As Judge I will take an oath of office to uphold the Constitution of the United States and Tennessee as well as the laws of this state. As a Judge I would implement the laws passed by Congress or the Tennessee General Assembly.

Very early in my practice, an *ex parte* order was in place where my client was to have no contact with his children. My client disclosed to me in a meeting that he was going to kill his children and his wife if he was not immediately allowed contact with his children. With privilege I am not allowed to reveal any information regarding conversations with my client pursuant to the Rules of Professional Conduct. However, once the husband made detailed threats upon my discussions with him about the nature of the *ex parte* order, it became necessary for me to disclose this conversation in order to prevent harm to his family. This early lesson in my career helped to shape me as an attorney.
