This form must be submitted within thirty days of the commencement of legal services.

3. By executing and submitting this form, you acknowledge all of the following:

-Registrant is in good standing with the entity that governs the practice of law in each jurisdiction where Registrant has ever been licensed to practice law;

-Registrant's license to practice law has not been revoked, suspended, or otherwise restricted in any jurisdiction in which Registrant has ever been licensed to practice law;

-Registrant agrees to abide by the Tennessee Rules of Professional Conduct and agrees to be subject to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the courts of Tennessee in regard to any acts or omissions related to the practice of law in Tennessee;

-Registrant will only engage in the limited pro bono practice of law authorized by Tennessee Supreme Court Rule 47 and related Orders of the Tennessee Supreme Court, without compensation, expectation of compensation or other direct or indirect pecuniary gain to the lawyer;

-Registrant will only provide legal services as assigned and supervised by the Tennessee Alliance for Legal Services and/or Legal Aid of East Tennessee;

-Registrant shall inform clients in Tennessee of the jurisdiction in which they are authorized to practice law, any limits of that authorization, and that they are not authorized to practice law in this jurisdiction except as permitted by Rule 47;

-Permission to practice law in Tennessee under Rule 47 will terminate when the Tennessee Supreme Court determines by separate Order that the emergency conditions have ended. A lawyer representing clients in Tennessee at that time will still be authorized to continue the provision of legal services for such time as is reasonably necessary to complete the representation. The lawyer, however, shall not thereafter accept new clients.
