Rule 10B, Section 3.03

## MOTION SEEKING DISQUALIFICATION OR RECUSAL OF APPELLATE JUDGE OR JUSTICE

[Amend Rule 10B, sec. 3.03 as indicated below:]

#### Section 3.03.

- (a) If a motion is filed seeking disqualification, recusal, or determination of constitutional or statutory incompetence of a one or two Supreme Court justices, the justices in question shall act promptly by written order and either grant or deny the motion. If the motion is denied, the justices shall state in writing the grounds upon which he or she denies the motion. If the justices denies the motion, the movant, within twenty-one days of entry of the order, may file a motion for court review, which shall be determined promptly by the remaining justices upon a de novo standard of review.
- (b) If a motion is filed seeking disqualification, recusal, or determination of constitutional or statutory incompetence of all-three or more of the justices of the Supreme Court, and if the motion is denied by the justices, no motion for court review shall be available pursuant to section 3.03(a).
