We have had a defendant run from the Courtroom, down the stairs, and out the door. He had to be tased outside the Courthouse.

We have had several defendants with medical needs that the deputies have had to step in and help with.

We are beginning to see more sovereign citizens. Not always, but a lot of times the need for an officer is there during these hearings and appearances.

We have had several unruly people in and out of the court rooms. (In the Clerk's office more than the Courtrooms.) The officers have been needed to deescalate the situations and have had to escort some out and have arrested one.

We do not have enough security staff to man the stand-alone magnetometers.
