ORDER


Tennessee Supreme Court Rule 7, section 2.01 governs the Bachelor's Degree and Law Degree educational requirements for eligibility to take the bar examination. The Court hereby amends Section 2.01(c) by deleting the existing language in its entirety and replacing it with the following new Section 2.01(c):

(c) The Board in its discretion may waive the requirement of graduation from an accredited undergraduate school if the applicant has graduated from either: (i) a law school accredited by the American Bar Association or (ii) a law school approved by the Board pursuant to section 2.03.

This amendment shall take effect upon the filing of this Order.
