ORDER

On December 27, 2006, the Court filed an order in which it created three-year terms for members of the Alternative Dispute Resolution Commission. The Court has now determined that it is in the best interest of the Commission to create term limits for Commission members. Moreover, the Court has historically appointed the Chair of the Commission to a two-year term and believes that it would be beneficial to formalize that term length in the existing rule. Therefore, the Court hereby deletes the existing language of subsection (a) of Tennessee Supreme Court Rule 31, Section 19, that reads: "The ADRC shall be appointed by the Supreme Court which shall name one of the ADRC's members as the Chair." Further, the Court replaces this language with the following:

The ADRC members shall be appointed by the Supreme Court to three-year terms. No member who has served two successive three-year terms shall be eligible for reappointment to the ADRC until three years after the termination of the most recent term. The Court shall appoint one of the ADRC's members as the Chair for a two-year term.

The Clerk shall provide a copy of this Order to LexisNexis and to Thomson Reuters/West. In addition, this Order shall be posted on the Tennessee Supreme Court's website.
